A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DENISON, TEXAS, A HOME-RULE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, ENDORSING THE EISENHOWER MEMORIAL COMMISSION'S DESIGN FOR THE DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER MEMORIAL AND ENCOURAGING ITS CONSTRUCTION TO HONOR THE LEGACY OF PRESIDENT EISENHOWER.

WHEREAS, President Dwight D. Eisenhower was born in Denison, Texas, and

WHEREAS, many of the qualities that he showed as a Five Star General of the United States Army, as the Commander of Allied Forces in Europe, and as the 34th President of the United States of America are qualities that are exhibited by Denisonians and our City is honored to be affiliated with the project, and

WHEREAS, the mission of the Eisenhower Memorial Commission is to "complete a National memorial to honor Dwight D. Eisenhower to inspire future generations with his devotion to public service, leadership, integrity, life-long work ethic, and total devotion to the values and practices of democracy," and




