WASHINGTON; NOVEMBER 18, 2015 – Senator Pat Roberts, Chairman of the Eisenhower Memorial Commission (EMC), today announced that Tim McGivern, has joined the Commission’s Advisory Committee. A Kansas native, Mr. McGivern holds a bachelor’s degree in History from the University of Kansas and a law degree from the Washburn University School of Law in Topeka, KS. In Washington, he has served in senior government and private sector positions, including Chief of Staff to Congressman and Senator Sam Brownback. He currently serves as a Principal at Ogilvy Government Relations, where he provides a broad array of clients with strategic counsel and advocacy, specializing in government relations and political strategy. Previously, he held senior positions in the Washington office of AT&T and at The United States Telephone Association (now U.S. Telecom), where he was a highly-respected advocate for the telecommunications industry on Capitol Hill.
